## **Board Member Position Responsibilities**

1. Regularly attends board meetings and important related meetings.
2. Is actively engaged in organizations or groups for which he/she was appointed to represent. Justice and Public Safety Representative: investigates the best practices for user groups in relative to education, training, and safety. Ensures information dissemination to user groups through KRTA. Explores trail policing best practices. Works closely with F&W, all user groups, Coal Industry and EEC, KRTA members

Responsibilities:

- Researches best practices for user groups relative to education, training, and safety.
- Researches other states policies are concerning trail education, training, and safety.
- Investigates insurance options for KACO members, local, or multi-county organizations
- Works closely with F&W, all user groups, Coal Industry and EEC, KRTA members
- Assist to formulate Safety rules for each user groups and posting of such
- Tracks trends in user group safety records (statewide and nationally)
- Participates on committees as requested by the Chair

**Between Meetings:**

- A. Works on above responsibilities
- B. Works on Committee assignments

**At Meeting, Report:**

- A. Informs Board of industry safety records for recreational user groups (KY / US) and summarizing ways to improve such.
  - B. training / educational, safety, or other issues or opportunities to address
  - C. Findings on trail policing opportunities
3. Makes serious commitment to participate actively in committee work.
  4. Volunteers for and willingly accepts assignments and completes them thoroughly and on time.
  5. Stays informed about committee matters, prepares themselves well for meetings, and reviews and comments on minutes and reports.
